PDE 3144: Introduction to Online and Blended Teaching Class 1

Course Description

This course is designed for educators who are interested in teaching online and/or blending their classrooms or schools. Educators will begin to understand that online and blended learning is not just about incorporating technology, but about changing their role and how they support students. The definition of blended learning, the four models, the best practices of teaching and learning in an online and blended environment are some of the topics covered in this three week class.

Objectives:

- Identify the best practices for teaching and engaging students online.
- Identify the philosophy of teaching online versus face-to-face.
- Explore different methodologies for providing online learning for students.

- Analyze the proper ways in which to communicate with people in an online environment.

Module Four – What are the Student Benefits

- Understand that online and blended teacher can make accommodations to meet the needs of individual students.
